### Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

### Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### Mandatory condition where the premises licence includes a Condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity:

- (1) Each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed—
  - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
  - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
    - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
    - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section—
  - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
  - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

## The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

### With effect from 6<sup>th</sup> April 2010

**1**. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act );

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or

process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be

considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

**3**. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

### With effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2010

**4**. (1) The premsies licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is avilable to customers in the following measures –

- (i) beer or cider: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pint
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the avilability of these measures.

# Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

# a) General – all four licensing objectives

Family entertainment – No film shall be exhibited unless:a) it has got a certificate of the British Board of film classification, b) it is a current newsreel. No person under the age of 18 shall be admitted to see any film which has been classified 18, also with othwer classifications of age limitations. The certificate classification will be shown on screen immediately before the viewing of the film. Any advertsiing of events including film which will include any relevant limitations on entry through age classification of the film being shown. There will be sign showing licensed in pursuance of act of parliament for public dancing and music. No disorderly conduct shall be permitted on the premises of any exhibition, film, recitation, acting, singing or dancing which is of an obscene character or offensive. There will be signs licensed in pursuance of act of parliament for cinematograph exhibitions. The licensee shall retain control over all parts of the premises. No alterations or additions to premises shall be made except with the prior approval of the licensing authority. All parts of the premises, and all fixtures and fittings therein, including seating, door fastenings and notices, floors, carpets and furniture, shall be kept claean and maintained in good order to the satisfaction of the licensing authority. The public part of the premsies shall be kept properly and sufficiently ventilated and heated. Adequate and apart snaitary conveniences suitably marked shall be provided and maintained for persons fo each sex. No unlawful lottery or game shall be permitted on the premises. Only one drink to be purchased per customer at last orders.

# b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Lighting exterior areas – vicinity of pub around site are all lit. Volence – in the event that anyone is becoming loud or behaving in a disorderly fashion they will be asked to leave. If they fail to do so the police will be called. Door Supervision – the venue is primarily a family entertainment venue, never promoting cheal alcohol as a sole attraction, with strict codes of conduct. There is a selective, but non discriminative policy on door control. S.I.A doorstaff will continue to be used in the correct numbers for entertainment events where more than 100 people are anticipated after midnight. A register is kept of any incidents and what doorstaff were working. Exckusion of troublemarkers – Anyone who looks at all doubtful, through dress or behaviour is refused entry. Last entry and re-entry time 11pm mid week and midnight Friday and Saturday night. Drug dealing and abuse – The presence of doorstaff and owners constantly survey and are vigilant. Staff are trained in what to look for. No open bottles or glasses taken outside of the beer garden or pub premises.

# c) Public safety

Capacity limit 200. Fire risks – weekly test emergency lights, every two months minimum test fire evacuation procedure and assess fire risks, recorded in fire safety book and actioned within one week. Fire warning code for staff to use in evacuation procedure. All exits and emergency routes highlighted. Appropriate

fire fighting equipment is avilable and staff will be trained to use it. Air condition units or extraction in all public rooms. Electrical installations are approved annually by certificate. Immediately prior to the admission of the public the nominated supervisor on duty will check all exits and passageways are unobstructed and functional. All standard conditions requested by the dire safety office in the interest of ehalth and safety will be adhered to. The lciensee will maintain suitable and sufficient insurance in respect of risk of fire and third party claims arising from the sue or the condition of the premises.

# d) The prevention pf public nusiance

Prevention of mass exodus at closing times – 30 minutes drinking up time to stagger volume. People leaving in a noisy or boistrous manner are marshalled from the premises and is persistent are banned. People congregating outside premises are moved on. Beer garden can be seen from inside the premsies. People are not encouraged to drink outside after dark. Entertainment other than background music will cease at midnight indoors.

# e) The protection of children from harm

all children under 16 are accompanied in the public bar area by an adult. Children are allowed into the premises without an adult, but only in the bar lounge areas until midnight when childred under 16 will be accompanied by an adult. The trade in the lounge bar areas will be mainly food once the kitched is built. Staff fully trained on under 18, only photo ID is accepted.
