Annex 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1 Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

(1) Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions.

(2) The first condition is that no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-

(a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or

(b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

(3) The second condition is that every supply of alcohol under the premises licence

must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

2 Mandatory condition: exhibition of films

(1) Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.

(2) Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection

(3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.

(3) Where-

(a) the film classification body is not specified in the licence, or

(b) the relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

(4) In this section-

"children" means persons aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

3 Mandatory condition: door supervision

(1) Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence

must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

- (2) But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed-
- (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section-
- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2014

With effect from 28th May 2014

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula –
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
where –
 - (i) P is the permitted price
 - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
 - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol
 - (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
 - (i) The holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
 - (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
 - (e) “valued added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order
2014

The below Mandatory Conditions **replace** the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and comes into effect **on 1st October 2014**

Conditions 1 to 4 refer to all premises that sell or supply alcohol for consumption on the premises. Condition 3 is relevant to Premises that sell for consumption off the premises.

1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

General- all four licensing objectives

- There will be a sign showing licensed in pursuance of act of parliament for public dancing and music.
- No disorderly conduct shall be permitted on the premises of any exhibition, film, recitation, acting, singing or dancing which is of an obscene character or offensive
- The licensee shall retain control over all parts of the premises
- No alterations additions to premises shall be made except with the prior approval of the licensing authority
- All parts of the premises, and all fixtures and fittings therein including seating, door fastening and notices, floors, carpets and furniture shall be kept clean and maintained in good order to the satisfaction of the licensing authority
- The public part of the premises shall be kept properly and sufficiently ventilated and heated
- Adequate and apart sanitary conveniences suitably marked, shall be provided and maintained for persons of each sex
- No unlawful lottery or game shall be permitted on the premises
- At last orders only one drink per person may be purchased

The prevention of crime and disorder

- Lighting exterior areas-vicinity of pub and major routes to and from pub around site all lit
- Violence-procedures are in place to guide staff and managers in how to deal with a potentially violent situation, i.e. calm approach, ask people to leave if can't keep quiet, then call the police
- Door Supervision-the venue is primarily a family and food venue, never promoting cheap alcohol as a sole attraction, with strict codes of conduct
- There is a selective, but non-discriminative policy on door control. Exclusion of troublemakers-anyone who looks at all doubtful, through dress or behaviour is refused entry, inc drunks
- Drug dealing and Abuse-the presence of owners or managers constantly survey and are vigilant and staff are trained in what to look for
- No bottles or glasses taken outside of the beer garden or premises

Public safety

- Capacity Limit 150
- Fire Risks-Monthly test emergency lights, every three months minimum test fire evacuation procedure and assess fire risks, recorded in fire safety book and audited within one week

- Fire warning code for staff to use in evacuation procedure
- All exits and emergency routes highlighted, appropriate fire equipment is available
- No one to smoke, drink or eat on the dance floor when in use. No smoking in the vicinity of the food areas. Extraction in main bar
- Immediately prior to the admission of the public the nominated supervisor on duty will check all exits and passageways are unobstructed and functional
- All standard conditions requested by the fire safety officer in the interests of health and safety will be adhered to
- The licensee will maintain suitable and sufficient insurance in respect of risk of fire and third party claims arising from the use or the condition of the premises

The prevention of public nuisance

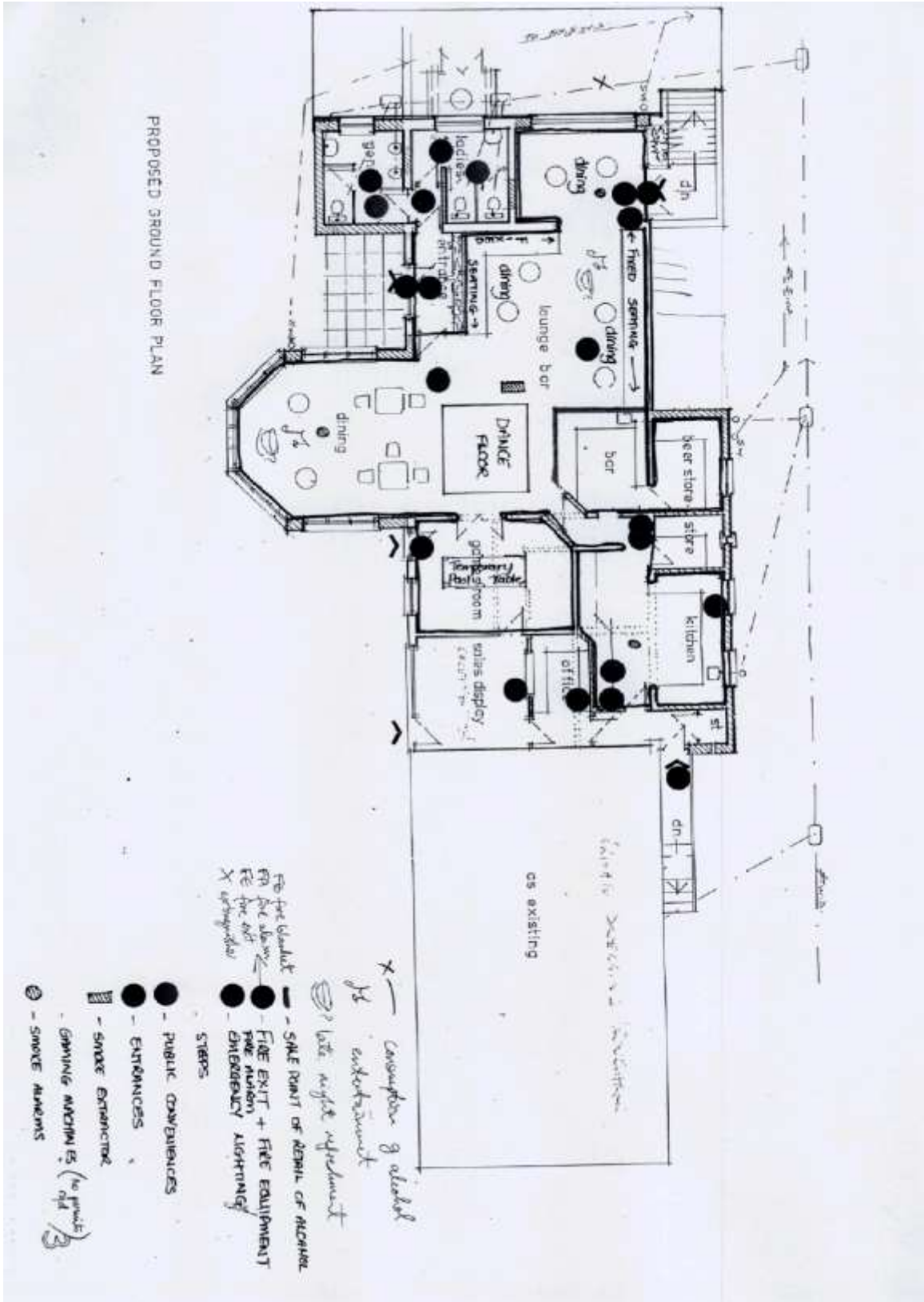
- Prevention of mass exodus at closing times-45 minutes drinking up time stagger volume. People leaving in a noisy or boisterous manner are marshalled from the premises and if persistent are banned
- People congregating outside premises are moved on
- Last entry time 11pm
- Beer garden can be seen from bar area. People are not encouraged to drink outside after dark
- Residents of the park are reminded in a newsletter of the behaviour standards required in the pub
- Windows and doors are shut at 11pm

The protection of children from harm

- All children are allowed in any bar area before midnight. After midnight all under 16's are accompanied by an adult.
- Staff trained on under 18, only photo ID is accepted

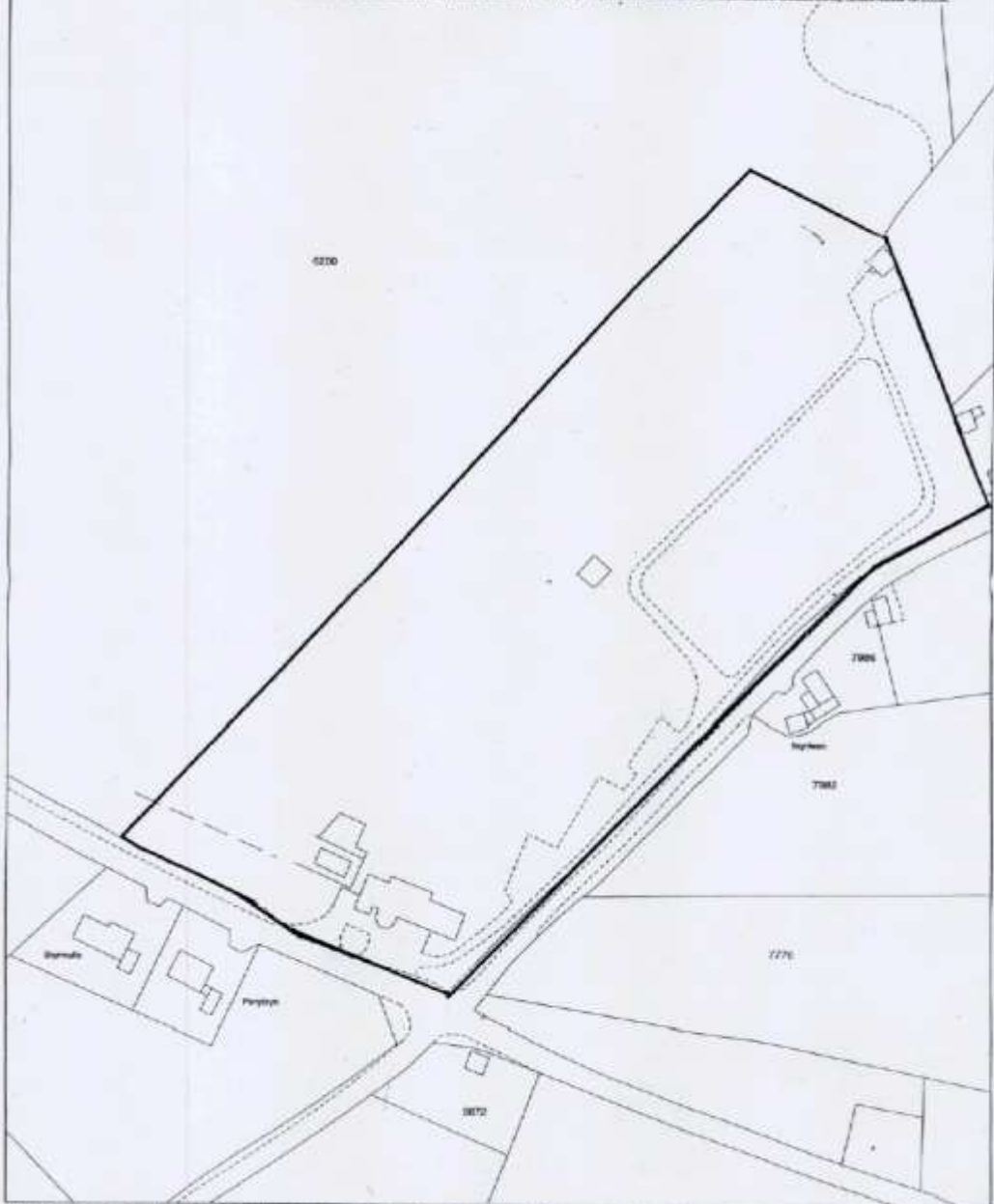
