Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where the premises licence includes a Condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity:

- (1) Each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed
 - in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to—
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section—
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

- a. General All four licensing objectives:- The premises are aiming to provide quality service for a small number of clients. The premises are newly refurbished and will be owner run by the applicants – Rona and Philip Dalton. Both clients have considerable experience in the licensed trade and have local knowledge of Borth as they have run a guest house and restaurant there for four years.
- b. Prevention of Crime and Disorder:- Having held three licences (a public house, coffee house and guest house) for a total of 17 years and being an ex police officer. I am aware of the problems the provision of alcohol caused.
- c. Public Safety:- The property has been totally rewired to comply with all the latest regulations. All bedrooms, hallways and every room have a smoke detector linked to the mains electric. All hallways and stairs have emergency lighting.
- d. Prevention of Public Nuisance:- The premises plan to provide luxury accommodation. Every attempt has been made to provide noise insulation this includes the building of a porch, putting in double glazing and sound proofing in all the rooms to keep noise to a minimum.
- e. Protection of Children from Harm:- No children will be allowed on the premises without an adult with them.
