Introduction

The number of school visits to Welsh farms increases each year. Unfortunately, this has lead to a similar rise in the level of bacterial infections such as E. coli and Cryptosporidium being picked up by children on these days out.

This pack aids the teaching of the concept of disease and disease prevention through effective hand washing. The activities within have all been linked to relevant sections of the National Curriculum in Wales at Key Stage 1 and 2, as well as to the relevant Key Skills sections.

The main aim of the pack is the teaching of an effective technique for hand washing after being present on a farm yard. However other issues, such as segregation of lunchboxes from the farm area for example, are also covered.

Why teach hand washing?

Research has shown that proper hand washing prevents the transmission of disease forming bacteria. As children of primary school age are particularly at risk from the contracting and transmitting of enteric infections effective hand washing needs to be taught from an early age and re-enforced regularly.

Other issues.

As children have initially a limited understanding of hygiene practices, have a high degree of close contact with each other and sometimes share facilities and food with each other, hand washing alone will not ensure a child will not pick up an infection.

By undertaking a number of simple activities (segregation of food and eating utensils from the farm area), the risk of transmission of enteric infections becomes lessened.

Activities

The following are a selection of activities that are aimed at helping to teach effective hand washing methods and give ideas of other steps that everyone can take to minimise the chance of an infection.

Activities

The activities listed here have been adapted from the Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council publication 'Hands Up for Hygiene'. The activities themselves have changed very little.

The work undertaken in this document has been to pick suitable lessons for the effective teaching of hand washing to pupils of Primary school, and to place these lessons within the context of the National Curriculum in Wales at Key Stage 1 and 2. As part of the document, some focus is paid to Key Skills, and these have been listed where relevant.

These are not exhaustive or exclusive lesson for the teaching of hand washing and hygiene. The topic can be developed further by looking at modern sanitation methods, and comparing these to those found in Roman, Tudor / Stuart, or Victorian times.

Other supporting activities may well be considered or developed to work in conjunction or instead of parts of this document. The important aspect of this is that the pupil is taught **why-when-how**;

Why - why it is important to prevent disease by hand washing

When – when it is the correct time to wash hands

How – how to correctly wash their hands.

Learning activity:- i) discuss with children when we wash our hands (after going to the toilet, before eating food, when they are dirty,




How to wash hands correctly

- Dry hands with a paper towel, clean towel or under a hot air dryer
