## **Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions**

### **Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol**

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **Mandatory condition where the premises licence includes a Condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity:**

- (1) Each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed—
  - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
  - (b) in respect of premises in relation to—
    - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
    - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section—
  - (a) “security activity” means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
  - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

## **Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule**

**Premises Licence is subject to Embedded Conditions converted under Licensing Act 1964.**

### **Promotion of Licensing Objectives**

- a. General – All four licensing objectives: All staff trained and aware of the law. Keep a log book with details of any refusal of intoxicating liquor drink sales. Holders of National Licensee Certificate on Site 90% of the time.
- b. Prevention of Crime and Disorder: Ensure that drunken, violent, or disorderly conduct do not take place on the premises. Do not sell alcohol to a blacklisted person. Alarm is fitted to the premises. Train staff to be vigilant.
- c. Public Safety: Do not sell alcohol to a drunken person.
- d. Prevention of Public Nuisance: Ensure no alcohol is consumed on or near premises.
- e. Protection of children from harm: No under age selling – if in doubt ask for identification. Try to ensure that no one over the age of 18 is purchasing on behalf of a minor. Display a sign stating that it is an offence for any person under 18 to buy or attempt to buy intoxicating drinks.
