Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where the premises licence includes a Condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity:

- (1) Each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed—
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to—
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section—
 - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

Premises Licence is subject to Embedded Conditions converted under Licensing Act 1964.

Promotion of Licensing Objectives:

- a. General All four licensing objectives: The types of regulated entertainment proposed re-instate and enhance the normal pub entertainment that were previously unregulated, with the benefit to enhance the local facilities for social entertainment and replace the focus on alcohol. Staff will be trained on the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and given drug awareness training.
- b. Prevention of Crime and Disorder: Providing an hour extension of opening hours after the end of the sale of alcohol will promote this objective as the last drink will be consumed less quickly, with access to the public toilets facilities and the provision of non alcoholic refreshment during this period. The DPS will be a member of the local pub watch so long as it exists.
- c. Public Safety: Fire safety training will be given to all staff employed on the location of exits and the use etc of equipment. All fire equipment checked and inspected annually.
- d. Prevention of Public Nuisance: Live music, Karaoke and voice amplification will end at or before midnight except for New years eve. Recorded music volume will be reduced to background level during wind down period to create mood change. A notice will be placed prominently at the exits asking customers to leave quietly. Kitchen extractor fans – filters will be cleaned weekly to minimise the possible cooking smells to neighbours.
- **e.** Protection of Children from Harm: The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply. Proof of age will be required to be shown by any one seeking to purchase alcohol who appear under 18 years. Children under the age of 16 will not be permitted in the bar area after 2100 Hrs. All electrical sockets have safety covers fitted.

Further agreements made in response to representations made by Pc John Evans, Police Licensing Officer.

- Drunken, violent and quarrelsome behaviour will be monitored very closely as to avoid any unruly behaviour on and off the premises. In house training will be given on how to deal with the situation.
- If live music is being played all windows and doors will be closed by 2230 hrs.
- All patrons to clear outside drinking areas by 2300 hrs.
- Public Liability Insurance required for premises.

Letter from Station Officer S. Evans, Mid and West Wales Fire Service: According to plan provided, the maximum capacity is 100 persons.
