Thank you for informing Ceredigion County Council of your intention to name your home. Before registering the new name, we would like you to take advantage of a 10 day respite period we offer so as to allow you the opportunity to consider the context of changing your property's name. Following the 10 day period, Ceredigion County Council will contact you asking for confirmation of your decision regarding the name of your property, before beginning the registration process.

Ceredigion is one of the Welsh language stronghold areas. This means that the Welsh language is an integral part of everyday life here.

Bound with the Welsh language is the rich and unique culture, history and identity of the local area and its inhabitants. As a result, a Welsh place-name or house name usually conveys information about the nature of the location, about its history, the area's culture, or the people who used to live there. Respecting local Welsh names and traditions can also sometimes ease the integration process and strengthen relations within the community.

Many new home-owners in Wales find themselves the proud owners of a property with a name they cannot pronounce or understand. Whilst we understand the temptation to translate or change the name into English, before making your final decision we would like to offer you an opportunity to reconsider.
