## Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

#### Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
  - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

#### Mandatory condition where the premises licence includes a Condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity:

- (1) Each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed—
  - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
  - (b) in respect of premises in relation to-
    - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
    - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section—
  - (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
  - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

# The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

# With effect from 6<sup>th</sup> April 2010

**1**. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act );

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or

process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

**3**. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

#### With effect from 1<sup>st</sup> October 2010

**4**. (1) The premsies licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is avilable to customers in the following measures –

(i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the avilability of these measures.

#### Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

#### a) General

Cardigan River and Food Festival has developed over the last 14 years as a family-friendly event, with a mix of river events, entertainment for adults and children, with stalls selling food and drink.

Three months prior notice of date of event to Police and Local Authorities. For 2013, the event will be held on the 10<sup>th</sup> August 2013.

### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

All stall holders selling alcohol, must abide by the Alcohol Traders Agreement (in premises file), not serving anyone who appears to be drunk, violent or disorderly.

Police are invited to be on site and security staff will be on hand during the festival to deal with any problems.

Door supervisors will be S.I.A licensed

2x SIA licensed door supervisors will be on duty at the event at all times

### c) Public safety

We have completed a health and safety risk assessment (in premises file). St John's Ambulance first aiders will be on site, with additional first aid kits available.

Fire fighting equipment will also be on site.

Licensed door staff will be used, supplementary by volunteer stewards, to ensure that the site is safe and orderly.

Marquees sited in area 2 will not exceed 50metres by 30metres Stages in marguees will not be more than 1 metre high

Only professional dance demonstrations will be held at the festival Fire extinguishers will be sited as per risk assessment. Fire blankets will also be made available.

# d) The prevention of public nuisance

The festival will operate as a family oriented daytime event. Noise levels will be monitored and residents and businesses surrounding the car park will be notified of the event in advance.

Licensed security staff and volunteer stewards will be on hand to deal with any public nuisance.

# e) The protection of children from harm

Our Alcohol Traders Agreement will ensure that any person attempting to purchase alcohol, appearing to be under 18, is challenged and relevant ID checked.

Activity providers engaging with children on site will be checked beforehand for their relevant CRB checks.

# Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority/ Mediation meeting

Mediation held between Applicant and John Evans, Police Licensing Officer on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March 2013. The following matters were agreed:

- Three months prior notice of date of event to Police and Local Authorities. For 2013, the event will be held on the 10<sup>th</sup> March 2013.
- Door supervisors will be S.I.A licensed
- 2x SIA licensed door supervisors will be on duty at the event at all times
- Marquees sited in area 2 will not exceed 50metres by 30metres
- Stages in marquees will not be more than 1 metre high
- Only professional dance demonstrations will be held at the festival
- Fire extinguishers will be sited as per risk assessment. Fire blankets will also be made available.
