Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory conditions where licence authorises supply of alcohol

- (1) No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence—
 - (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- (2) Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory condition where the premises licence includes a Condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity:

- (1) Each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
- (2) But nothing in (1) above requires such a condition to be imposed—
 - (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c. 12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) in respect of premises in relation to—
 - (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
 - (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).
- (3) For the purposes of this section—
 - (a) “security activity” means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and
 - (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010

With effect from 6th April 2010

1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children –

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

(i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or

(ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

With effect from 1st October 2010

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

5. The responsible person shall ensure that –

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

Promotion of Licensing Objectives

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 9)

THE APPLICANT WILL BE THE DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR, AND WILL SUPERVISE AND MANAGE THE PREMISES. IN THE ABSENCE OF THE APPLICANT FROM THE PREMISES, A SUITABLE RESPONSIBLE PERSON WILL BE AUTHORISED BY THE APPLICANT TO SUPERVISE THE PREMISES. THE APPLICANT WILL CONTINUE TO OPERATE THE PREMISES AS A RESTAURANT, WITH THE PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THE BUSINESS BEING THE SALE TO CUSTOMERS OF SUBSTANTIAL TABLE MEALS FOR CUSTOMERS TO ENJOY IN A RELAXED ATMOSPHERE.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

BOTTLES & GLASSES

- 1) CUSTOMERS CARRYING OPEN OR SEALED BOTTLES OR GLASSES ARE NOT ADMITTED TO THE PREMISES AT ANY TIME.
- 2) BOTTLES AND GLASSES ARE REMOVED FROM PUBLIC AREAS WHEN FINISHED OR EMPTY.

CRIME & DISORDER

- 1) ALL INSTANCES OF CRIME AND DISORDER WILL BE REPORTED TO THE POLICE AS SOON AS IS REASONABLY PRACTICABLE

c) Public safety

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FIRE SAFETY

- 1) ALL EXIT DOORS ARE EASILY OPERABLE WITHOUT THE USE OF A KEY, CARD, CODE OR SIMILAR MEANS.
- 2) EXIT DOORS ARE REGULARLY CHECKED TO ENSURE THAT THEY FUNCTION SATISFACTORILY.
- 3) ALL REMOVABLE SECURITY FASTENINGS ARE REMOVED WHENEVER THE PREMISES ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC OR STAFF.
- 4) FIRE EXITS AND MEANS OF ESCAPE ARE APPROPRIATELY SIGNED.
- 5) EXIT DOORS OPEN OUTWARDS, OR ARE SECURED IN THE OPEN POSITION.
- 6) ADEQUATE AND APPROPRIATE FIRST AID EQUIPMENT AND MATERIALS ARE AVAILABLE ON THE PREMISES.

LIGHTING

- 1) IN THE ABSENCE OF ADEQUATE DAYLIGHT, SUITABLE AND SUFFICIENT LIGHTING IS PROVIDED AND MAINTAINED IN ANY AREA ACCESSIBLE TO THE PUBLIC.
- 2) FIRE SAFETY SIGNS ARE ADEQUATELY ILLUMINATED.

SAFETY CERTIFICATES

- 1) THE PREMISES HAS A CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTION FOR PORTABLE FIREFIGHTING EQUIPMENT. AN INSPECTION WILL BE CARRIED OUT EVERY YEAR AND A NEW CERTIFICATE OBTAINED EACH TIME.
- 2) THE PREMISES HAVE, AND WILL MAINTAIN PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE TO COVER UP TO £2 MILLION POUNDS.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

A NOTICE IS DISPLAYED AT THE EXIT TO THE RESTAURANT ASKING CUSTOMERS TO LEAVE THE PREMISES AND THE AREA QUIETLY.

e) The protection of children from harm

THE APPLICANT INTENDS TO SUPPLY BEERS, CIDERS OR WINES (NOT SPIRITS) TO YOUNG PERSONS AGED 16 OR 17 PURCHASED BY AN ACCOMPANYING, SUPERVISING ADULT AGED 18 OR OVER FOR CONSUMPTION ANCILLARY TO A TABLE MEAL.
