Audit Wales recommends that we:

- Use <u>Local Wellbeing Plans</u> to provide a comprehensive and co-ordinated focus on tackling poverty
- Use our local strategies, targets, and performance reporting for tackling poverty to support the targets and actions in the revised <u>Child Poverty Strategy for Wales</u> <u>2024</u>
- Develop SMART local actions with a greater emphasis on prevention.
- Involve other public sector partners, 3rd sector and those with experience of poverty
- Include a set of consistent outcome indicators and measures to increase understanding of poverty locally
- Publish annual public reports to enable a whole system view of poverty locally
- Improve our understanding of our residents' 'lived experience' through involving them in decision making, using 'experience mapping' and/or 'Poverty Truth Commissions' to review and improve accessibility to and use of our services.
- Develop a single Web landing page for people seeking help
- Streamline and improve application and information services for people living in poverty

This Work programme describes how we will build on our work on Ceredigion Tackling Poverty Strategy 2020-2024, support the delivery of Ceredigion Local Wellbeing Plan and respond to the recommendations above.

Caveat

Care should be taken in the interpretation and use of percentage uptake of Healthy Start vouchers as:

- Pregnancies are included in the number of people on the digital scheme as this is the most accurate data we hold.
 Pregnancies are not included in the eligible beneficiaries data which is provided to the NHSBSA (NHS Business Services Authority) by DWP and HMRC
- Both the number of people on the digital scheme and eligible beneficiaries do not include those people who are not able to make a digital application to the scheme. This includes those who receive a legacy benefit such as Income Support, or people who are under 18 and pregnant who do not receive any benefits.
- The number of people on the digital scheme may include ineligible or duplicate applications. Following audit and investigation, if we find that the published data includes ineligible or duplicate applications, cases like this are identified and removed from the scheme and the published data will not be amended retrospectively.
